About the Alliance

What is the Federal Academic Alliance?

Pace University partners with the U.S. Office of Personnel Management (OPM) to offer exclusive tuition discounts to eligible Federal employees across the country. This alliance recognizes and supports the ongoing professional development of the Federal workforce—nationwide.

Tuition Discounts

How much is the discount for Federal employees?

- Undergraduate Programs: 15% off online tuition (already approx. 50% less than oncampus part-time tuition)
- **Graduate Programs**: 15% off the standard on-campus graduate tuition rate

These discounts apply only to programs listed on the Pace Federal Alliance Portal.

Does this discount apply to all Pace University programs?

No. The discount is only available for select fully online undergraduate and graduate programs featured on the Federal Alliance Portal.

Why aren't campus-based programs included in the discount?

The Alliance is designed specifically to support online learners—making flexible, remote education more accessible to Federal employees nationwide. On-campus programs are not included in the tuition discount at this time.

Eligibility & Application Process

Who is eligible for the Federal employee tuition discount?

All active Federal employees are eligible to apply.

5 Financial Aid & Loan Programs

Can I apply for Federal financial aid?

Yes! Pace Online students can apply for:

- Federal Direct Stafford Loans (subsidized/unsubsidized)
- Pell Grants

Pace FAFSA Code: 002791

Pace also proudly participates in the **Yellow Ribbon Program** for veterans.

What is the Federal Student Loan Repayment Program (FSLRP)?

FSLRP allows agencies to repay student loans as an incentive for recruitment or retention. This is managed by each **individual Federal agency**.



What is Public Service Loan Forgiveness (PSLF)?

PSLF forgives remaining Direct Loan balances after 120 qualifying payments while employed full-time in public service.



Transfer Credits

Can I transfer previous college credits to Pace Online?

Yes! Pace offers a generous and flexible transfer policy:

- Up to 68 credits from a two-year institution
- Up to 90 credits from a four-year institution

We typically accept:

- Courses with a grade of C (2.0) or higher
- Credits earned from exams like CLEP

Each applicant's transfer evaluation is done individually and typically takes **2–3 weeks** after official transcripts are received.

How can I check if my courses will transfer?

Use our Transfer Credit Equivalency Tool for a quick preview. Final decisions are made in consultation with your program chair.

Online vs. On-Campus Programs

Are both online and in-person programs included in the Alliance?

No. The Federal Academic Alliance applies only to **select, fully online programs**. On-campus or hybrid courses are not eligible for this benefit.

Understanding Degree & Tuition Assistance Programs

What's the difference between an academic degree program and a tuition assistance program?

Academic Degree Program

- Part of an agency's strategic development plan
- Requires a competitive selection process
- Governed by 5 U.S.C 4107

Tuition Assistance Program

- Pays for individual courses or classes
- Does not require a competitive process
- Governed by 5 U.S.C 4101(4)
